- 2006 – 10th place overall
- 2007 – 7th place overall, 3rd best club at 200m Breaststroke, 4th best at distance Freestyle, 6 swimmers in the Top 8 BAGCATS, 9 medals won by a boy and 6 won by a girl (new club records)
- 2008 – 63 qualifiers (highest ever), 6th place overall (highest ever), 5th best boys club (highest ever) and 6 swimmers make Top 8 in BAGCATS
- 2009 – 74 qualifiers (highest ever), 7th place overall, 5th best boys club, 5 swimmers make Top 8 in BAGCATS, 2 Surrey County Junior Champions at 200m Fly and 100m IM, 41 medals (6 Gold, 15 Silver & 20 Bronze) and increase of 11 from 2008. New boys record with 10 medals won.

ASA National Championships – BAGCATS & YOUTH

- **2007** – 1st girl for CASC to qualify in over twenty years at 100m Back & 100m Free. Male Youth swimmer qualified at 50m Free.
- **2008** – Male Youth – two qualifiers at 50m Free. Male BAGCAT qualifier, was ranked first at short course 100m Brst in the run up to the Nationals. Qualified at 100 and 200m Breaststroke. 12yr boy made the final at both the 100 & 200m Breaststroke coming 5th and 4th respectively. Chosen for the ASA ID Talent Programme Level 1 camps.
- **2009** – 1st relay team ever to qualify for CASC. Boys BAGCAT 4 x 100m Free relay team coming 26th in the UK. Youth girl qualifies at 50 & 100m Free coming 12th at the 50m Free. Youth boy qualifies at 100m & 200m Fly coming 13th and 9th respectively. 13yr old qualifies at 100m & 200m Breaststroke and 100m Fly. Wins Bronze at 200m Brst and Gold at the 100m Brst becoming National Champion and his time of 1.10.85 being one of the fastest in the world for a 13yr old boy.
