

C.A.S.C. race to highest placing

The 2007 Surrey County Championships saw history being made with C.A.S.C. finishing in 7th position overall with a total of 585.5 points, an improvement of 168.5 points from 2006. The boys stand in overall 6th place and the girls in 10th. A total of 37 medals, 3 golds, 15 silvers and 19 bronze with a further 110 4-8 placings. A wonderful result for the club's swimmers showing the new strength in depth over the past year. 230 Pb's were achieved over the course of the Championships.

This year CASC took its strongest contingent of Breaststrokes and distance Freestylers to the Championships and came away with record medal wins. In the distance Freestyle CASC stands as equal 4th best club with a total of 8 medals and in the 200m Breaststroke we won 7 medals and are ranked 3rd in Surrey.

Sam Crowther set a new CASC record with 9 medals. Hot on his heels were Francesca Hayward 4 silvers and 2 bronze, Hik Harazawa 3 silvers and 2 bronze and Katy Hogan with 1 silver and 3 bronze.

Six swimmers reached the top 8 in the BAGCAT's with Alice Hogan in 3rd, Karl and Hiro Harazawa reaching 6th and 8th respectively, Eloise Crowther, David King and William Epps all in 7th place.

The 2007 Champs also saw ten swimmers capture their very first Surrey medals so congratulations to Hik, Francesca, Karl, Rosanna, Neil, Ciaran, Daniel, Stephanie, Catherine and Alice Hogan.

CASC Head Coach Chris Hatton said: "We have had a fantastic result this year. I would like to personally thank all my coaches and teachers at CASC but also to all our swimmers. Keep up the hard work and we will now be looking forward to the Regionals and then the Nationals".
